

Instructions for use in MICROWAVE

We sincerely appreciate your faith in choosing “MASTERCOOK” Microwave safe food reheatable containers, saving your valuable time. Food you lovingly cook in advance for your family can be stored in the Refrigerator, in the same microwave products. You are ready to reheat your food in Microwave oven and serve your family with unrestrained affection in the same container as well.

The distinctive venting cap on the seal of the container releases the excess steam and seal takes precautions against food splashing about in your valuable microwave.

For the purpose of your utmost safety and satisfaction, the following precautions have to be always adhered to when you are using “MASTERCOOK” containers in your Microwave & Refrigerators. • MICROWAVE compliant reheatable products are always safe for food temperatures ranging from 0 to 120.

- Open the small steam valve before keeping the sealed container in the Microwave Oven so as to avoid steam built up which may be dangerous. Always avoid air tight/water tight lids on such containers while reheating in your Microwave.
- Upon removing such containers from the Microwave, always ensure to keep the steam valve open for some time before you close it.

- Always ensure to keep your fingers a bit away when you remove the cover or lid of the microwave container to avoid injuring them from hot steam.
- Always make sure that you reheat cooked food when it is taken from the refrigerator only or is at room temperature but not directly from the Deep Freezer.
- The container is likely to get damaged if you put the deep frozen food into the Microwave for thawing.
- Avoid using high oil, fat and sugar contents food for reheating as it can cause overheating of food in a very short time, thus forming blisters on the products.
- Rinsing the food containers immediately after use in cold water will avoid strong smells or stains on the containers.
- MASTERCOOK does not guarantee non-staining of products.
- Microwave products are designed for reheating and storage in the refrigerator. You should strictly avoid using them in the deep freezer as they tend to become brittle, thus get crack at the slightest pressure.
- MASTERCOOK products are not designed to be used in conventional oven or grill.
- NEVER use the containers at the backing oven, on the gas cooker or the electric cooker. Never put the boxer next to a direct heat source.
- In MASTERCOOK product range the valve for steam outlet is a vital part of the whole lid system covering the cooking process. So any damage caused to it by using force to twist the hinges or remove may result in breakage resulting in non-performance of the product.
